Intellectual stimulation and interdisciplinary research: Research in the Randall Centre is at the interface of biomedical and physical sciences and is focussed on using interdisciplinary approaches to discovering how cells work, and continues the legacy of pioneering research in biophysics including the X-ray crystallographic studies of DNA by Rosalind Franklin and Maurice Wilkins

Supporting environment: We provide a very supportive environment for our PhD students. There are many opportunities for additional training of technical and transferable skills.

Career opportunities: Most of our PhD graduates continue careers in science as post-docs in academic and industrial laboratories or science-related careers such as grant administration, science journalism and intellectual property.

Stipend and Fees: Students will be funded for four years full-time PhD study, receiving a tax-free stipend of £18,368 per year. Tuition fees will be fully-funded by the studentship

Application Process

The studentship is ONLY open to students who are citizens of, and ordinarily resident in, countries in Africa and who are not already a graduate of King's College London
